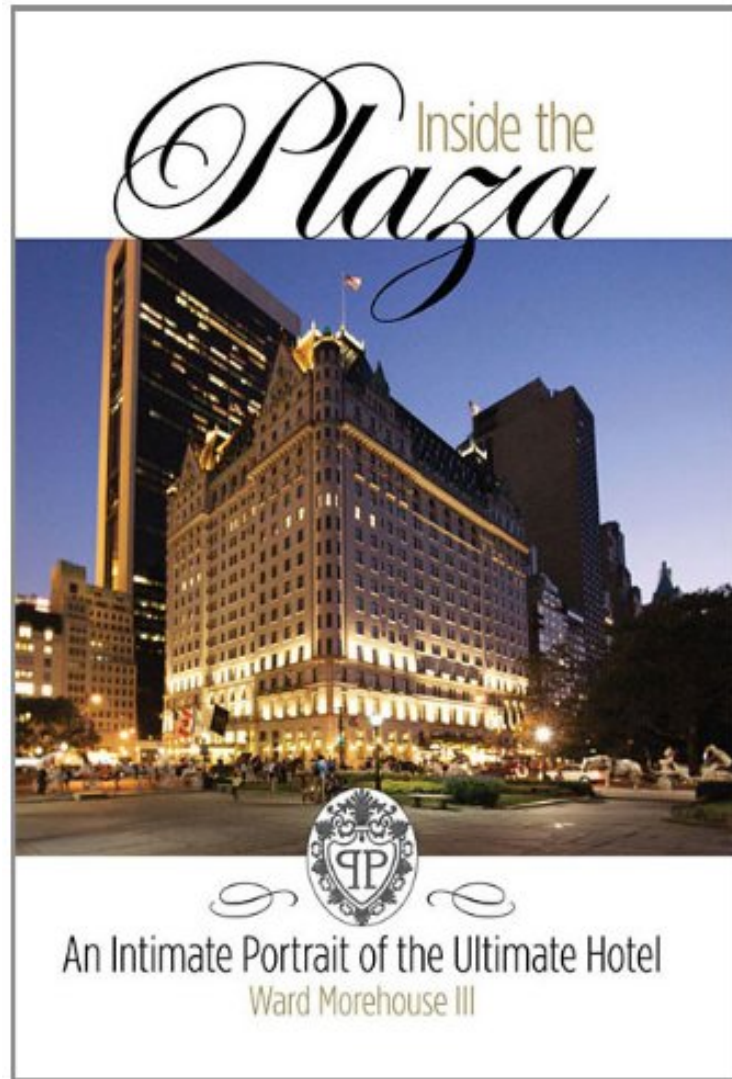

I was really looking forward to reading this book, and the subject matter is inherently fascinating. That said, this book is so badly written - and unedited - that it was painful to read. Structurally, the book was all over the place - bouncing from topic to topic, era to era, guest to guest, owner to owner, and back again. It was a challenge to make meaning from the garbled sentences and paragraphs. If I hadn't been so interested in the subject matter, I would have just tossed the book in the recycling bin (which is what I'm planning to do with it, now that I'm done. While I keep most books for my library, this one is unworthy). Even more difficult was wading through all the typos, sentence fragments, and misspellings. The book certainly doesn't live up to the high standards of quality one would expect of anything associated with The Plaza hotel. I can only conclude that this book's editor was asleep at the wheel, or nonexistent.
