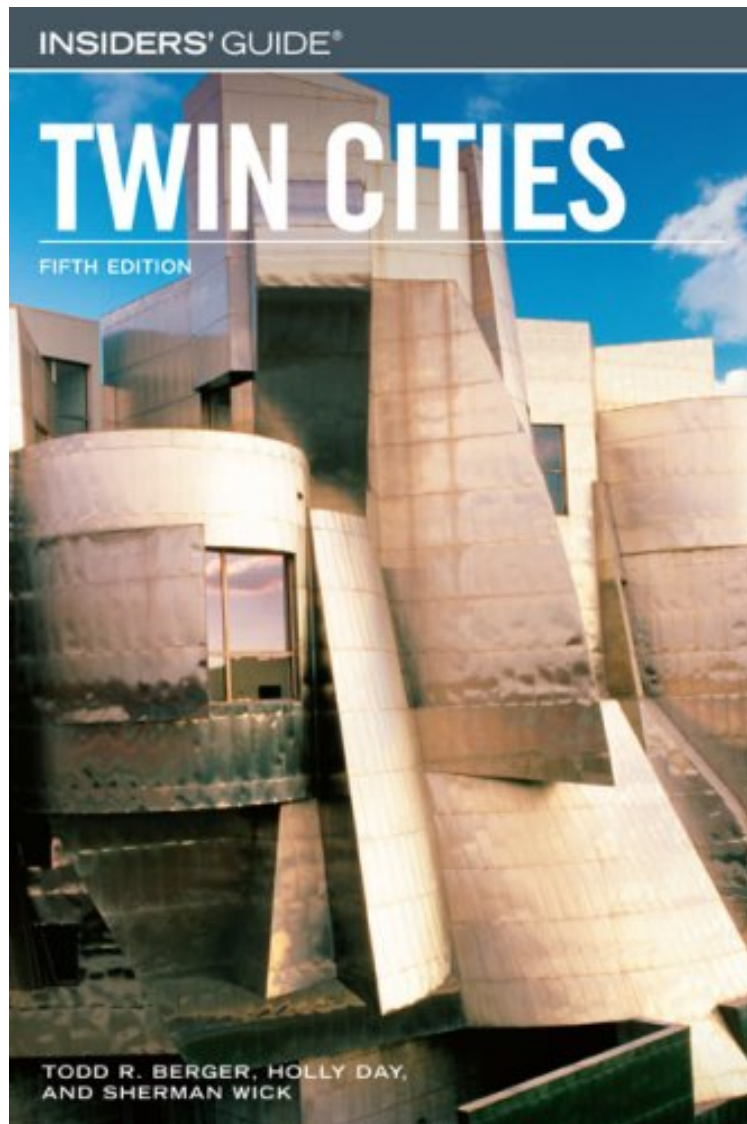

And no, there's no "Dinkytown" on any map, nor ANY of the neighborhood names sprinkled throughout the text. There were two U of Minn. campuses shown, however, so naturally you'll go to the wrong one.
