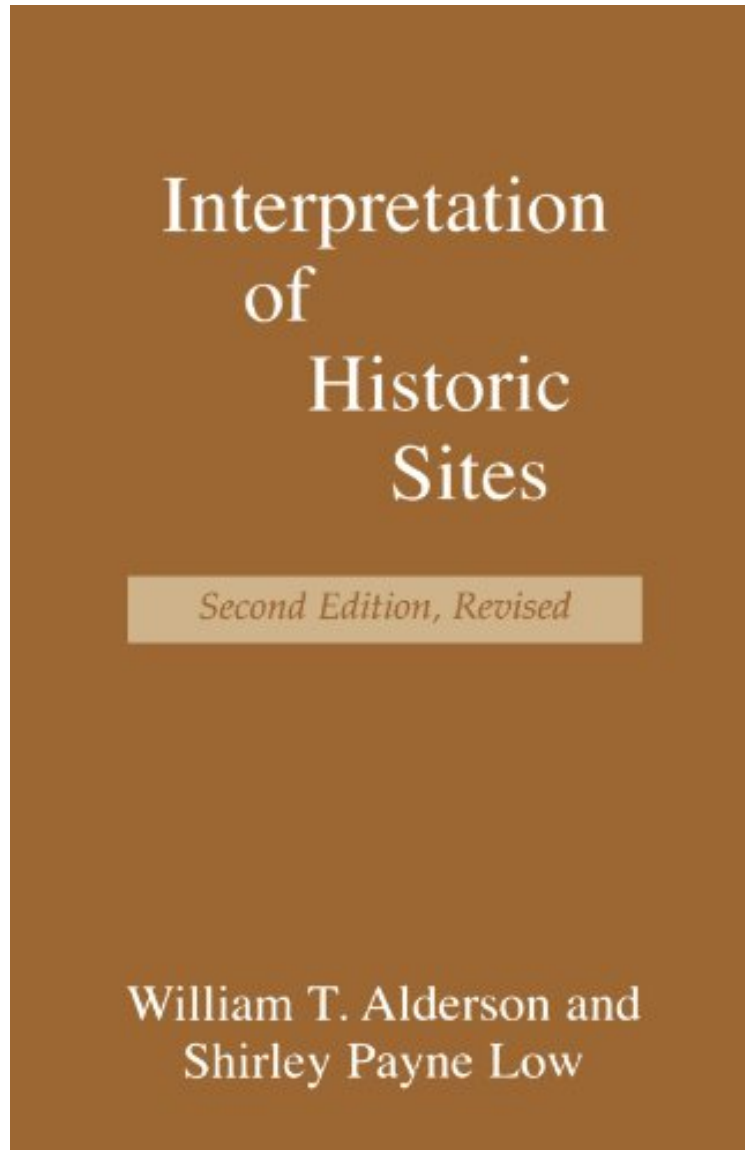

The authors argue that sites do not need a large budget or abundant resources in order to provide high quality interpretation at their site. The first step is identifying site objectives, which includes identifying what type of site it is (documentary or representative). The authors define interpretation as both a plan and an activity; the goal of both types of interpretation is to promote understanding between the site and its visitors. After identifying site objectives, the next interpretive step would be creating an interpretation plan, which involves knowing who the sites visitors are and why they come, with attention to research, organization, and good taste, as well as both the primary and secondary objectives of the site. According to the authors, successful interpretation is dependent on regular accessibility to the site, ease of navigation once there, and perhaps most importantly, the personnell manner; making the visitor comfortable is essential. The authors acknowledge the true importance of a skilled interpretive staff to the success of the site. Besides advice on selecting and training interpretive staff, the book also briefly addresses alternate form of interpretation, such as: publications, audiovisuals, and working with school groups. It encompasses not only the content of exhibits and guided tours but bathrooms and parking, dealing with the trustees, and publications for your gift shop. With Tilden, it's one of the classic texts of the genre.Like Tilden, this book is showing its age. Its high-technology options include slide shows, to take just one example. The regulatory and legal environment for historic sites has also changed. The book doesn't talk about fundraising or the political controversies that might be lurking around interpretation choices.Still, if you keep those limitations in mind, they've done a good job thinking through the challenges that any historic site faces. It's a short and accessible introduction to the issue.
