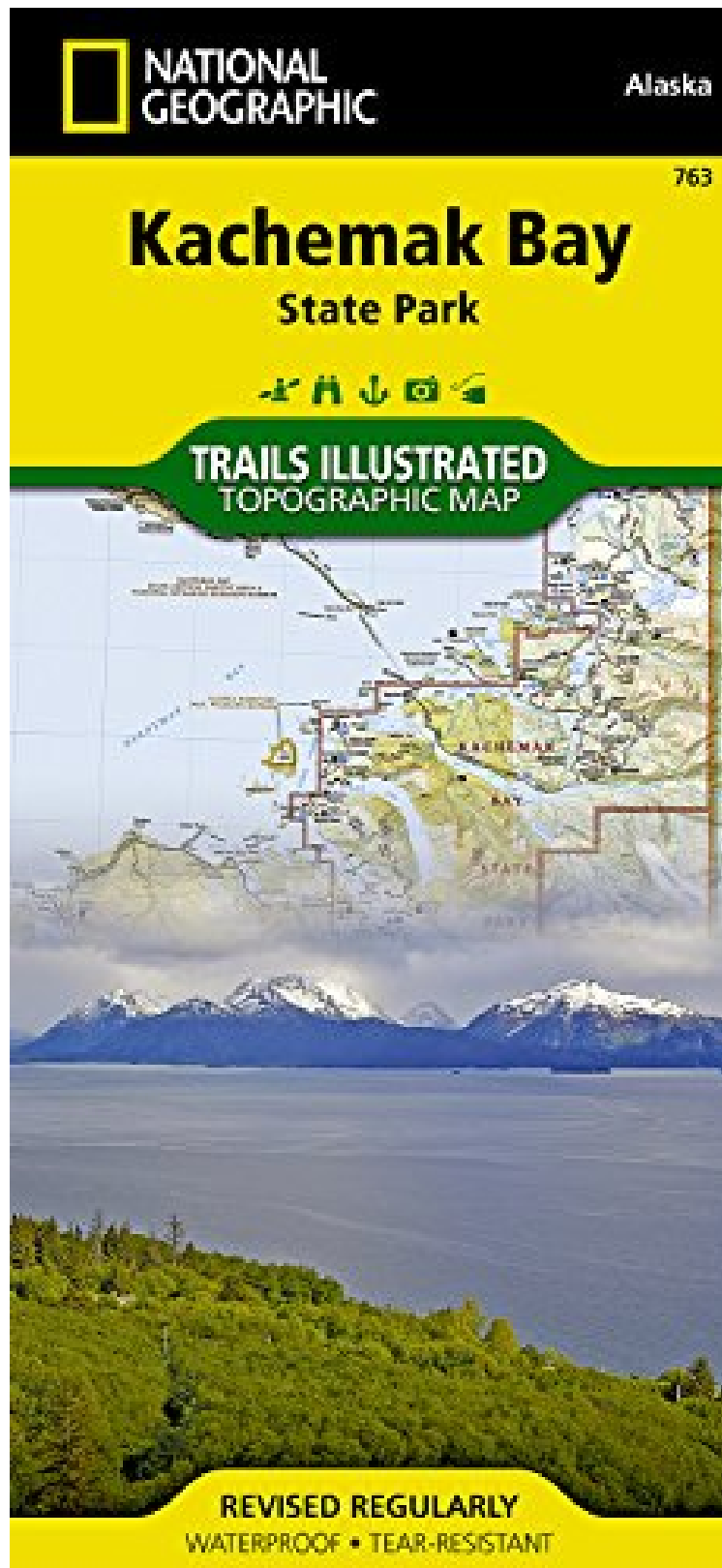

Across Kachemak Bay by water taxi is Kachemak Bay State Park, where the mountains and glaciers meet the sea, in a beautiful and wild recreational area criss-crossed by trails.The National Geographic Map "Kachemak Bay State Park, Alaska" is an essential piece of gear for exploring the area. The scale is 1:105,000, which is appropriate for the large area it covers. The map is water resistant, flexible, easy to fold, and tucks away into a pocket or rucksack.The Map has two sides. One side shows Kachemak Bay State Park and State Wilderness Park, across the bay from Homer. An insert shows the landing points in Halibut Cove Lagoon. The reverse side shows the town of Homer, the Kenai National Wildlife Preserve, and the road network on the west side of Kachemak Bay. Critical details include the popular hiking trails to Grewingk Glacier."Kachemak Bay State Park, Alaska" map is very highly recommended for those who plan to explore past "the end of the road."

Essential park information is also provided, including background information, safety tips, points of interest, park guidelines and contact information. Every Trails Illustrated map is printed on "Backcountry Tough" waterproof, tear-resistant paper.
