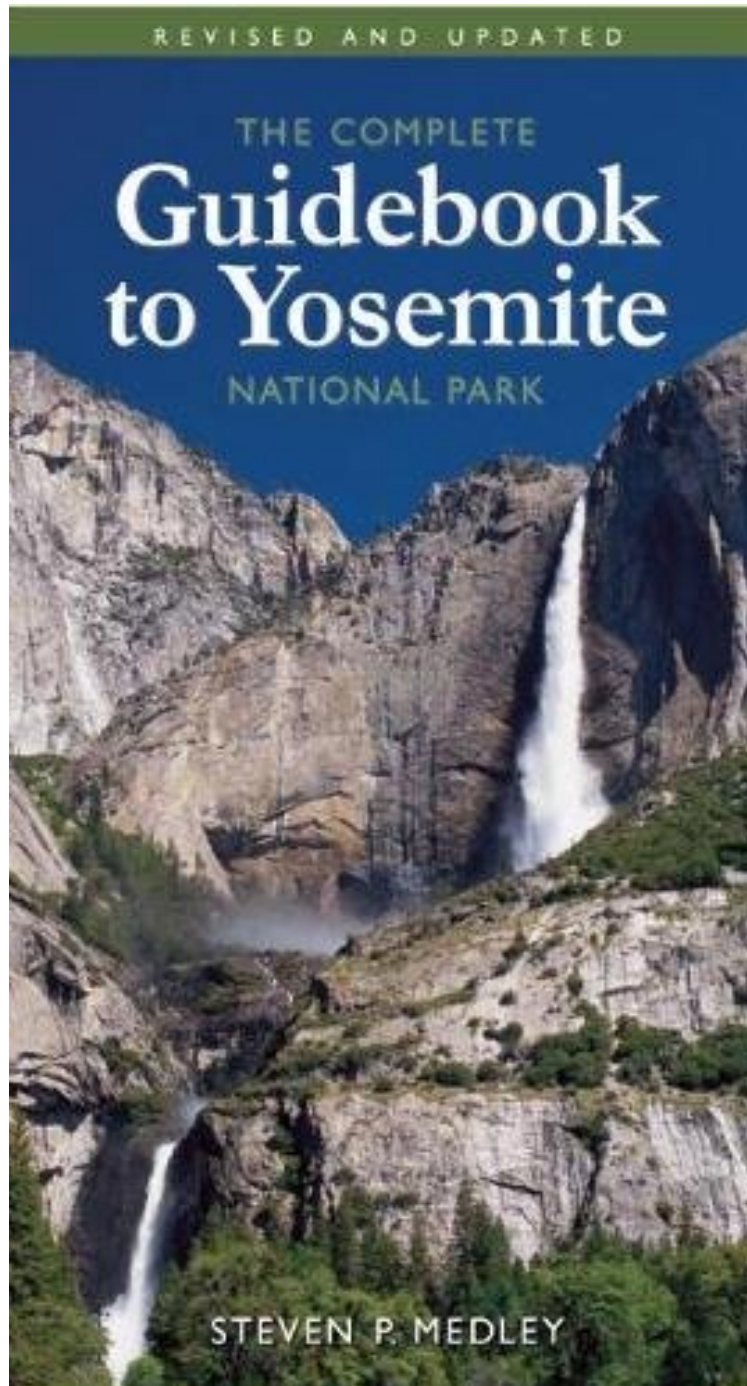

Even for just \$11, I expected more detail. I wanted it to tell me the stuff I couldn't find on the park's website. I have glanced through the book, and it appears to basically take all the stuff from the website and put it in a book. And it's not even organized clearly. Also, the maps are difficult to read, especially when trying to pull the book wide open to see down in the crack. It gave me hints such as "apply early for permits" or "go during the off-season". I guess if you don't look know how to use the internet and haven't seen the park's website, this book might be for you. I was looking for a trail guide book, and this wasn't it unfortunately. Also included are information on roads and gateway communities, tips on how to reserve a campsite, photos of flora and fauna, and a list of important phone numbers. New to this seventh edition are updated information on internet and mobile phone access, a history of rock climbing in the area, and all new photographs and maps.
