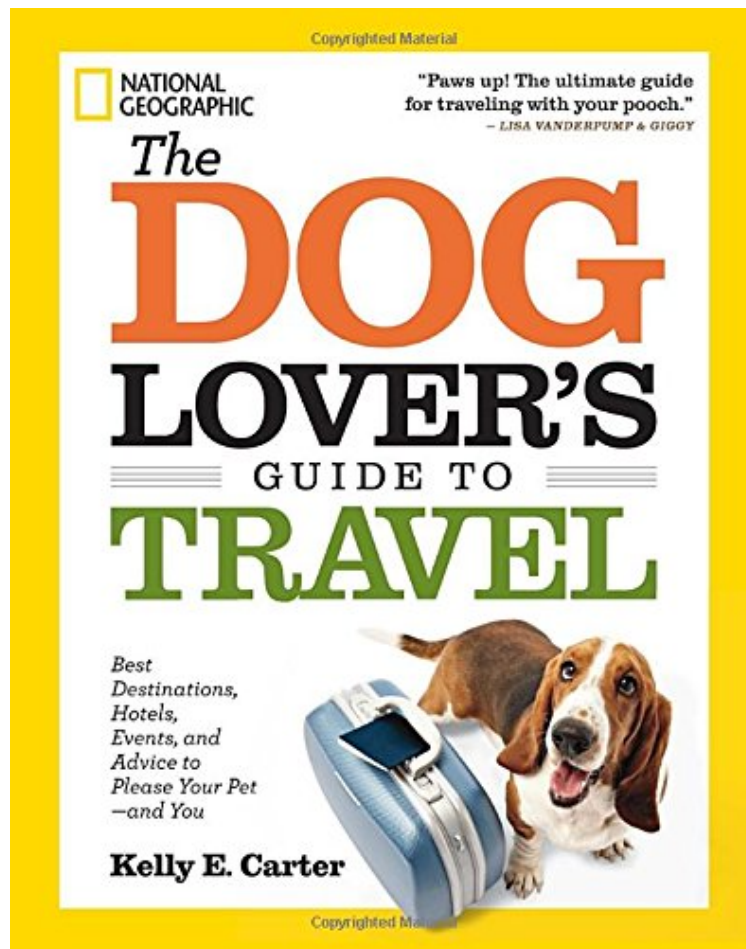

The recommended hotels are on the pricey side and many of them have weight limits. I'm not sure how the destinations were picked as not all of them sound that dog friendly to me (dogs only allowed on beach after 6pm? Restaurants that don't allow dogs on the patio? Etc).
